
Lawyer:

Journalist:

Tour Guide:



Librarian: Curate historical collections in libraries. Assist researchers in accessing historical resources and information.








Lecturer: Teach history at the tertiary level, conducting in-depth research and sharing expertise. Contribute to academic discourse through lectures and publications.

Famous People in History








