	• It is to provide you with an opportunity to reflect on and write about your experience of CBA 2.
	• It is not marked by your class teacher; it is sent to the State Examinations Commission (SEC)
	for marking as part of the state-certified examination in History.
	• The Assessment Task is related to your learning on which the second Classroom-Based
	Assessment is based: CBA 2 – A Life in Time.
WHAT DOES THE ASSESSMENT TASK CONSIST OF?	 The Assessment Task consists of two stages:
	 First, engaging with a piece of stimulus material to prepare for the written task.
	 Second, reflecting upon and writing about your experience in completing A Life in Time. You
	will complete an answer booklet during this part.
THE ASSESSMENT TASK WILL COMPRISE SOME OR ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:	 Engagement with a short stimulus in visual, written, audio or audio-visual format to prepare for the written task.
	 A written task that tests you in one or more of the following:
	Your ability to demonstrate your understanding of historical concepts by applying your
	historical thinking to researching the life of a person in history in A Life in Time.
	Your ability to evaluate new knowledge or understanding that has emerged through your avperience of A Life in Time
